MEETINGS

The full alliance came together at the California Academy of Sciences for in-person working meetings in February and May. As a group, we developed a vision statement, values, desired outcomes, initial project ideas, and a shortterm governance structure. We also formed committees to take on some focused work after those meetings. Thank you to all who have served on the Planning/Steering, Hiring, and/or Communications Committees in 2023!

In November, we were excited to see 35 RSF members attend the Nature Filled Schoolyards listening meeting led by Cadi Poile, Executive Director of Facilities at San Francisco Unified School District and RSF Steering Committee member. We had an engaging conversation about the ways our alliance can support bringing nature to schoolyards across San Francisco. This is the very first RSF project the group has kicked off, and we are looking forward to continued collaboration on project plans. PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ALLIANCE



On September 7th, California Biodiversity Day, we publicly announced the RSF alliance with a press conference on the Academy's Living Roof. The event brought together RSF member organizations, local government officials, and members of the media to celebrate the alliance and member organizations' collective action to improve the ecological health of San Francisco and equitably distribute the benefits of local nature to all. WEBSITE LAUNCH

In August our website went live! Since then, we have had 22,000 visitors to the site, and hundreds of people have signed up to receive updates about our alliance happenings. We are looking forward to adding more details about RSF projects and events in 2024.



During the launch, we heard remarks by the Academy's Dr. Scott Sampson, followed by RSF members Dr. Hollis Pierce-Jenkins of Literacy for Environmental Justice and Tyrone Jue from the SF Environment Department, and District 8 Supervisor Rafael Mandelman.

Remarks were followed by planting of California natives on the Academy's Living Roof. The event was a great success and was featured in many local press outlets.
